NOTICE UNDER REGULATION 21

The proposed development at **Land at Cairnoch Hill, Carronbridge** is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment under the Town and Country Planning (Environment Impact Assessment) (Scotland) Regulations 2017 as it is likely to have significant effects on the environment.

Notice is hereby given that an EIA Report has been submitted to **Stirling Council** by **SLR Consulting Limited** on behalf of **Eurowind Energy Limited** relating to a 'major' planning application in respect of: the installation and operation of up to 4no. wind turbines (up to a maximum overall height of 180 metres) and associated infrastructure (known as Cairnoch Hill wind farm).
